Provide intensive support with in-class tutors and a strong student–teacher relationship.

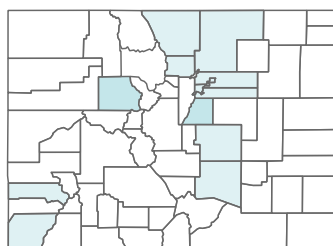
Create a positive peer group for students.

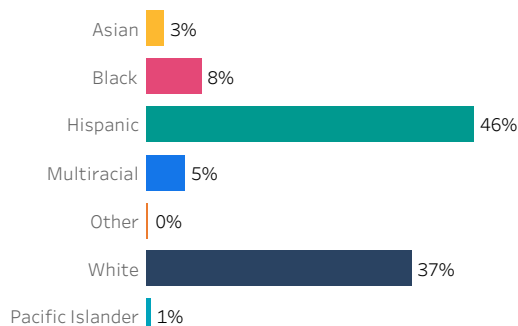

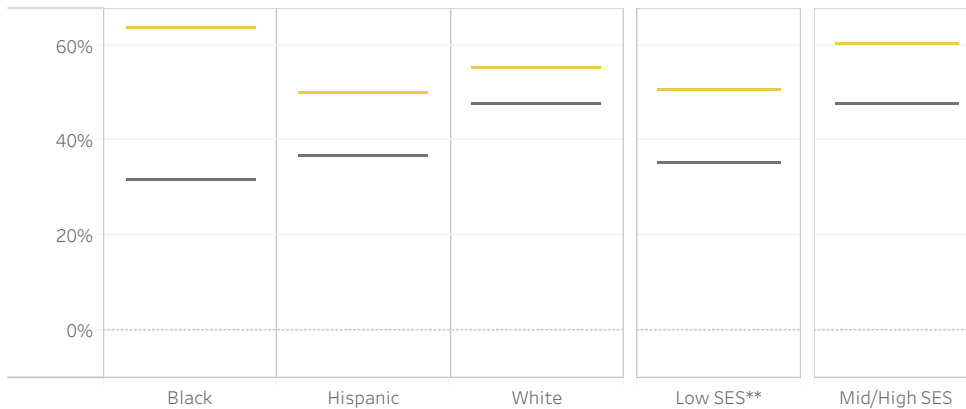
