



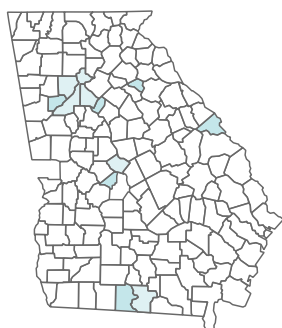
# Georgia Snapshot

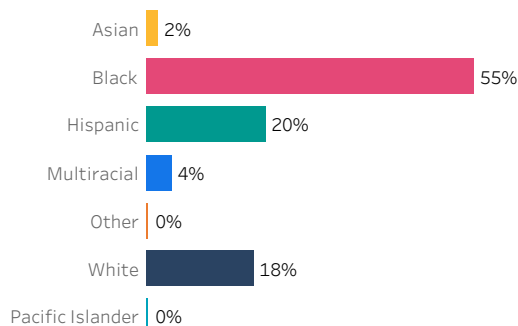

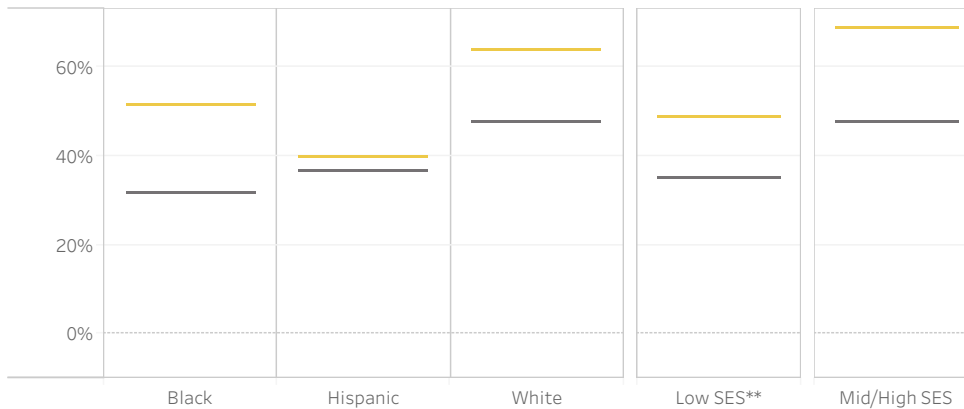
