



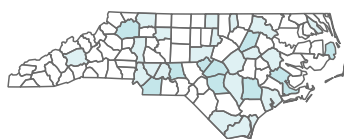
North Carolina Snapshot

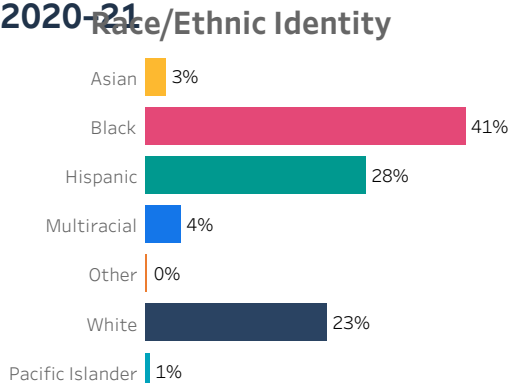

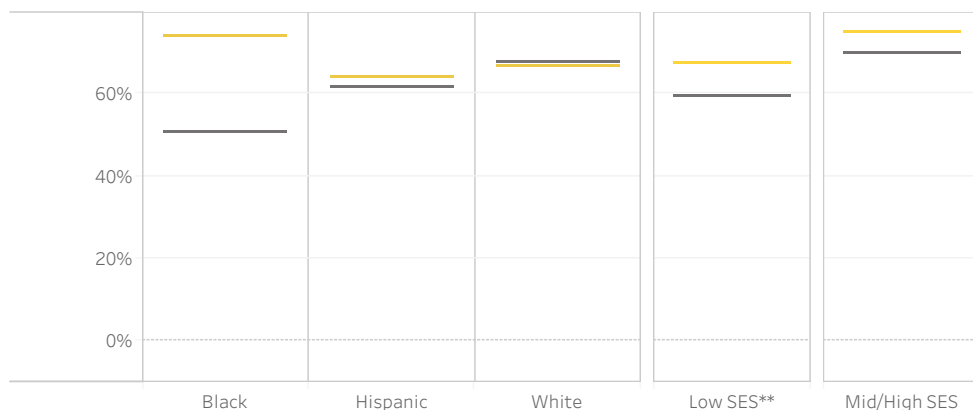
