

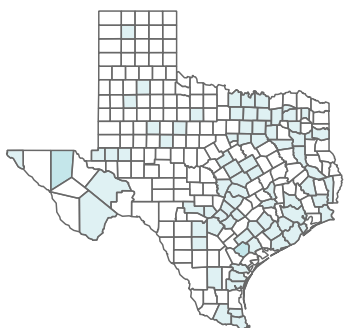


Texas Snapshot

Create a positive peer group for students.

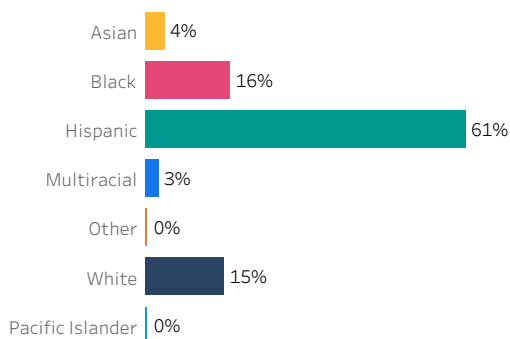
Develop a sense of hope and personal achievement through hard work and determination.

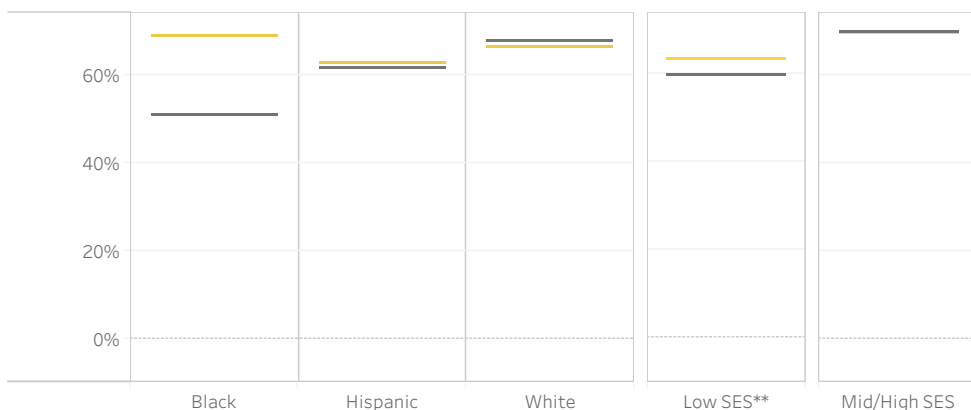
